

## PNWIC Travel-Oregon Horses Headed to Washington

### General requirements

All equidae must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued less than 30 days prior to entry.

Equidae includes:

- Horses
- Asses
- Donkeys
- Mules
- Zebras

### Horse passport

The Six-Month Equine Certificate (also known as a horse passport or extended validity CVI) is valid for travel in the following states:

- Washington
- Oregon
- Idaho
- California
- Montana requires a lifetime brand certificate to accompany the passport

The Six-Month Equine Certificate cannot be altered once it is issued. The issuing veterinarian must indicate the states of intended travel and the Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) will send a copy of the certificate to each.

**Owners, please remember:** It is your responsibility to keep track of every trip out of state. At the end of the six-month period, you send a copy of both the front and the back of the CVI to each state checked on the front. The Trip Record form and the mailing addresses for the participating states are on the back of the owner's copy of the certificate.

### Testing requirements

A negative test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) is required less than 6 months prior to entry. Tests with "pending" results are not acceptable.
